



## United States Student Achievers Program 2011 Application Form

There are many talented economically-disadvantaged students in Nigeria who lack only financial resources and access to information to enhance their educational opportunities.

For the fifth year, the United States Embassy in Nigeria seeks to identify highly academically qualified and motivated, low-income, SS 3 “O” level students to join the United States Student Achievers Program (USAP). USAP works with students through regularly scheduled meetings and seminars to assist them throughout the application process to secure admission and scholarships to study in colleges and universities in the United States of America. USAP finances the costs of the application process and provides free membership to the US Educational Advising Center for its participants. Although we do not limit the program geographically, students **MUST** be able to appear in person at our Abuja office on a regular basis during the school year. In addition, full participation is required during school holidays and after O level exams. The SS 3 students will work with our educational advising staff to attempt to secure placement and financial assistance to begin study in the US in August 2012. **ENTRY INTO THIS PROGRAM IS NO GUARANTEE OF A SCHOLARSHIP OR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STUDY IN THE UNITED STATES.**

To apply to USAP, you must currently be a highly determined and hardworking SS 3 student who has or will write "O" level examinations in 2011. Applicants must have a strong academic and co-curricular record as well as demonstrated financial need. For consideration, please complete and return this application form via mail or in person with the required documents listed, no later than **April 30, 2011**.

- 2) A letter of recommendation from one a teacher, headmaster, pastor or community leader who knows you well and can attest to your character and skills.
- 3) A copy of your end-of-year report from your SS 2 year and, if possible, your first term report from SS 3.
- 4) Two written essays, one from Group A and one from Group B. Essays should be at least one page:

**Group A – Choose one only**

Colleges and universities officials in the United States are interested in learning and knowing about you, both inside and outside the classroom. Use this essay as an opportunity to reflect on who you are, how you think and what's important to you. It is important that your essay gives a clear description of you; the reader is not looking for the most dramatic tale. Therefore, it is essential that all experiences related in these essays are a **true factual** and accurate depiction of your life.

A1. To what extent and how does your culture, language and tradition shape you as a person? In a world that is a mixed salad of cultures, how can you preserve your own culture while learning to respect others? How will you handle negative stereotypes and ignorance about your country and culture?

A2. Describe a situation where you and your opinion were in the minority. How did you make yourself heard and how did you deal with the response to your decision or opinion? What can you learn from this experience and how can you apply the experience to your future? (Please tell a true experience from your own life.)

A3. Explain a risk that you have taken that has influenced your life greatly, either positively or negatively. What have you learned about yourself and about risk taking from this experience?

**Group B – Choose one only**

No matter whether you have studied science, commercial or arts subjects at O' levels, if you attend a U.S. college or university you will be exposed and required take a wide variety of subjects from the humanities, social sciences, and pure sciences. With liberal arts education in mind, please answer one of the following questions to show us your intellectual strengths.

B1. "Rigorous reasoning is crucial in mathematics, and insight plays an important secondary role these days. In the natural sciences, I would say that the order of these two virtues is reversed. Rigor is, of course, very important. But the most important value is insight – insight into the workings of the world. It may be because there is another guarantor of correctness in the sciences, namely, the empirical evidence from observation and experiments"

B2. "Stereotyped beliefs have the power to become self-fulfilling prophecies for behavior"

B3. What is the greatest scientific discovery so far in the history of humankind? Describe its positive and potentially negative impact to justify your choice. Now if you could make one scientific discovery in your life, what discovery would you want to make and why?

B4. "Literature is the best way to overcome death. My father, as I said, is an actor. He's the happiest man on earth when he's performing, but when the show is over, he's sad and troubled. I wish he could live in the eternal present, live in the present and to remain in the pantheon of the future. Literature is a way to say, I was here, this is what I thought, this is what I perceived. This is my signature, this is my name."
